REGULATIONS

1. Juniors can enter only junior classes for their age group. Juniors may enter adult classes but points gained will not count towards Junior Trophies.
 2. Every exhibitor must send to any of the persons stated on the entry form, not later than **4th September 2018**, a list of classes in which the exhibitor intends to compete. All entries must be accompanied by the entry fee or they will not be accepted. The fee for each entry will be **50p for Adult classes**, with a maximum charge of £5.00 irrespective of the number of entries. **Under 15yrs class entries are free.** No entries will be accepted on the day of the Show.
 3. In cases where a certain space is specified for an entry such space must not be exceeded.
 4. Exhibitors may enter only one exhibit in each class except where otherwise stated. **Exhibits must not have previously been exhibited** in any "Cox Green Horticultural and Craft Show".
 5. Entries are open to all.
 6. Exhibits must have been grown by or have been the work of the exhibitor, the exception to this rule is material used in classes 21 & 22 and 201-204 of the Floral Arrangements Section and classes 11, 12, and 143 of the Vegetable, Fruit and Flowers Sections. Infringement of this rule will debar the exhibitor from any prize whatsoever in that or any other class.
 7. Exhibits inadvertently entered in the wrong class, will at the Committee's discretion, be put into the right class.
 8. No name or mark of any kind by which it shall be possible to discover to whom any article belongs shall be allowed on any exhibit until after the prizes have been awarded. Any exhibitor so offending shall be debarred from any prize whatsoever in that class. The only exceptions to this are classes in Photography and Junior Art - see relevant notes in these sections.
 9. Exhibits will be received between 08.30 and 10.15am on the day of the Show. No entries will be received after this time. Everything for competition must be staged ready for the judges by 10.15am on the morning of the Show, when all persons must leave the grounds until the Show is opened to the Public at 2.30pm, except those officials whose duties require them to be present. Exhibitors will not be allowed to interfere with or remove anything until 5.00pm.
 10. All exhibits must be removed by 5.30pm on the day of the Show unless it has been indicated on the entry form that these are available for sale for Show funds. Any exhibit remaining after this time will be disposed of as decided by the Committee.
 11. The Judges shall be at liberty to add to, reduce or withhold prizes and certificates offered in any class according to the merit of the specimens exhibited. The decision of the Judges shall be final. In all cases when prizes are awarded for points these shall be calculated as follows: -
 - 1st prize - 3 points
 - 2nd prize - 2 points
 - 3rd prize - 1 point
 12. Objections must be delivered to the Chairman in writing before 3.00pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of 50p, when the Committee will enquire into the matter. If the objection is found to be valid, the deposit will be refunded and the Committee will deal with matter as they may think fit; but should the objection not be sustained the deposit shall be forfeit. The decision of the Committee shall be final.
- N.B.** The above regulations together with any special regulation for Sections contained hereafter must be strictly adhered to. The Committee will not accept anything for competition under any other conditions. They will take all possible care for the safety of exhibits but cannot hold themselves responsible or liable for any damage or loss.

ADULT CLASSES

VEGETABLE, FRUIT & FLOWER SECTION

JUDGE **Mr M. LITTLE**

- Please note carefully the quantities for each class.
- All classes will be judged in accordance with the Royal Horticultural Society's Show Handbook.

N.B. Judges will award points for:-

- **Fruit/vegetables at its ripest**
 - **stalks retained for showing**
 - **fruit and vegetables not polished or scrubbed**
 - **exhibits disease and pest free.**
 - **Compliance with the stated size/weight where specified**
-
- **All entries must be home grown excepting for class 143.**
 - **Exhibitors may enter more than one exhibit in classes 117 and 122**
 - **Exhibitors may enter more than one exhibit in class 119 of different types of soft fruit**
 - **If variety names are supplied , these are to be placed under the name card until after judging**

CLASSES Vegetable and Fruit

101. Four Tomatoes over 3cm diameter - **same variety - calyx to be left on**
102. Six Cherry Tomatoes 3cm diameter & under - **same variety - calyx to be left on**
103. Heaviest Marrow
104. Three Courgettes minimum length 10cm - maximum length 20cm
105. Six Runner Beans
106. Four Beetroot
107. Three Carrots
108. Four Onions each weighing less than 8oz
109. Four Onions each weighing 8oz or more
110. Nine Pickling Shallots not more than 3cm in diameter - **displayed on bed of sand**
111. Nine Exhibition Shallots over 3cm in diameter - **displayed on bed of sand**
Note – Classes 108-111 Onions and Shallots – necks need not be tied but if tied, uncoloured ties should be used.
112. Four Potatoes
113. Six French Beans, including borlotti beans
114. A collection of Five Fresh Edible Herbs - **in a vase not more than 8"/20cm high**
115. A single pumpkin or squash
116. A Collection of Four Kinds of Vegetables, **one of each**
117. Any other vegetable not included above **a matched pair**
118. Four Apples **same variety**
119. Soft Fruit **same variety – not more than 20 berries - displayed on a flat plate**
120. A dish of Six Plums or Gages or Damsons
121. Four Pears **same variety**
122. A dish of fruit not specified in any other class

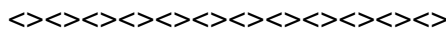
HANDICRAFT SECTION

- Note - a. Classes 305-314 - please state whether self designed
- b. Your own model may be used for display where appropriate
- c. Class 306– a manufactured card frame may be used

CLASSES

- 301. Item of Hand Knitting (excluding soft toy or doll)
- 302. Item of Crochet
- 303. Item of Lace – any method except machine made
- 304. Dressmaking - any article of clothing, machine or hand sewn
- 305. An item of hand embroidery, which may be in a frame
- 306. A greetings card to include an item of handicraft in any medium
- 307. Any Soft Toy or Doll
- 308. An item of cross-stitch which may be in a frame
- 309. An Item of tapestry or long stitch which may be in a frame
- 309a. A framed picture using materials other than just threads
- 310. Item of Patchwork
- 311. Item of Wood, Leather or Pottery
- 312. A decorated hat in any medium. A bought hat may be used. Judged on decoration only
- 313. A bookmark in any medium
- 314. Item of Handicraft not covered by the above Classes. (More than one may be entered in different media)



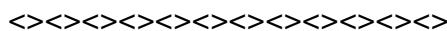
PRESERVES SECTION

JUDGE Mrs R WESTACOTT

- Note - a. Competitors may enter more than one exhibit in these classes.
- b. Each entry must be labelled showing the class number and type of entry.
- c. Each entry must appear on separate line on entry form with name of fruit stated.
- d. An exhibitor’s number will be issued on the day and this must be attached to entry.
- e. All preserves should be presented in a jar with a screw lid, no wax circles to be used.
- f. Label stating type of preserve and date made to be on side of jar.

CLASSES

- 401. Soft Fruit Jams
- 402. Jams from Stone Fruits
- 403. Vinegar Pickles - red cabbage, eggs, onions, etc
- 404. Chutney - green tomato, sweet mustard, etc
- 405. Curds
- 406. Jellies
- 407. Marmalade from Citrus Fruit- tinned pulp must NOT be used
- 408. Unusual Preserve
